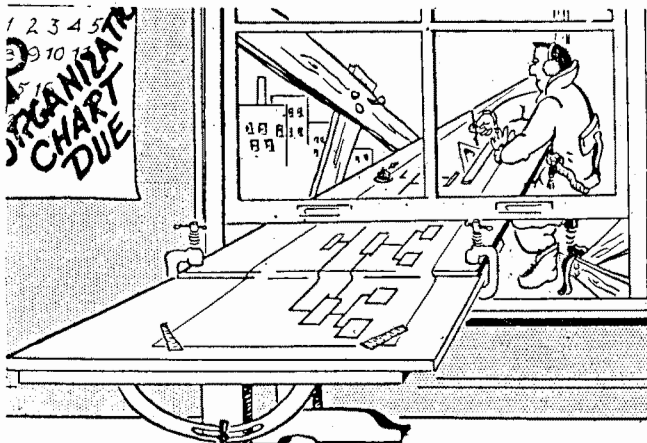

## FROM OUT OF THE PAST

PAGE NEWS FEB 1964:

THE VIETNAM TROPO PROJECT "BACK PORCH" WAS ONE OF THE BIGGEST CRASH PROGRAMS PAGE HAS EVER UNDERTAKEN. FROM INCEPTION IT WAS A DAY AND NIGHT, SEVEN DAYS A WEEK JOB. IT TOOK THE COMBINED EFFORT OF EVERYONE INVOLVED. FROM AWARD IN FEB 1962 UNTIL SCHEDULED COMPLETION IN SEPT 1962, THERE WAS A LITTLE OVER SEVEN MONTHS TO SUBCONTRACT FOR EQUIPPING OF VANS, SITE PREPARATION, SHIP - INSTALL THE EQUIPMENT, AND BUILD THE ANTENNAS FOR ONE OF THE LARGEST TRANSPORTABLE TROPOSCATTER NETWORKS IN THE WORLD.

IN ORDER TO BRING IN SUPPLIES AS QUICKLY AS POSSIBLE AND BEGIN CONSTRUCTION, ONE MILLION POUNDS OF MATERIAL WERE AIR LIFTED TO VIETNAM. THIRTY 35-FT VANS WEIGHING APPROX 30,000 LBS EACH, 60-FT OFFSET ANTENNAS, ELECTRONIC EQUIPMENT, AND STRUCTURAL STEEL WERE LOADED INTO GIANT GLOBEMASTERS. IT WAS ONE OF THE LARGEST AIR LIFTS EVER ATTEMPTED AT THE TIME AND NOT ONE PIECE OF EQUIPMENT WAS LOST.

MODERN MECHANIZATION COULD ONLY HELP SO MUCH, THEN MOTHER NATURE DECIDED TO GET INTO THE ACT. "WE ARRIVED IN QUI NHON AT THE TAIL OF A TYPHOON WHICH HAD BLOWN HALF THE ROOF OFF OUR VILLA. AFTER TWO WEEKS OF RAIN AND WIND STORMS WITH 55 MPH WINDS, WE HAD TO USE BULLDOZERS TO MOVE THE SAND DUNES FROM THE SITE. PLANES COULDN'T LAND (RUNWAYS DAMAGED) AND THE EQUIPMENT HAD TO BE BROUGHT IN BY LST." (RALPH GAZE)

AT PHU LAM THE MONSOON CAME IN FULL FORCE. THE PAGE SITE HAD BECOME AN ISLAND IN THE MIDDLE OF A RICE PADDY SEA. TO MEET THIS EMERGENCY THE FIRST PAGE NAVY WAS CREATED. (2nd WAS PERU ASK BLISS, MITCHELL OR COOK) ONE HUNDRED RICE BOATS WERE USED TO MOVE EVERYTHING, EVEN STEEL AND CEMENT TO THE SITE. AT UBON THE STORMS WASHED OUT THE BRIDGE OVER THE MUN RIVER AND THE CREWS TOOK A BOAT TO WORK EACH DAY. BUT DESPITE WORKING ROUND THE CLOCK AND ALL THE PROBLEMS THERE WAS STILL TIME TO ENJOY THINGS LIKE BERNIE O'BRIEN'S TEN MINUTE HARMONICA CONCERT BROADCAST OVER THE ORDERWIRE. TOM KING RIDING THE DANANG KIDS AROUND ON HIS MOTORCYCLE OR BOOKERS INFAMOUS QUI NHON YACHT CLUB (ONE LEAKY BOAT WITH REED SAIL AND ROCKS FOR BALLAST). IN SEPT 62, ON SCHEDULE, THE SYSTEM BEGAN TO CARRY TRAFFIC.

**SAME ISSUE OF THE PAGE NEWS REPORTS:**

SAMSUN, TURKEY. THE PAGE SITE MANAGER, NICK OKTAY, DISCOVERED A SOURCE OF WATER FOR THE SITE, BUT LOCAL CONTRACTORS FAILED TO BID ON THE CONSTRUCTION. OKTAY ARRANGED FOR LABORERS FROM THE THREE NEIGHBORING VILLAGES TO DO THE WORK. THE LABOR AGREEMENT PROVIDED FOR A FOUNTAIN AT THE BASE OF THE HILL WHERE THE SITE WAS LOCATED AND ANOTHER AT ROADSIDE. WHEN THE NEWS OF KENNEDY'S ASSIGNATION REACHED THE AREA THE PROVINCIAL SHERIFF, MEHMET HAKGUDER, SUGGESTED TO OKTAY THAT THE ROADSIDE FOUNTAIN BE DEDICATED TO THE PRESIDENTS MEMORY. THE JOHN F. KENNEDY CEMSI (FOUNTAIN) WAS DEDICATED WITH THE RITUAL MOSLEM SACRIFICE OF 10 LAMBS.
